Student Council and National Honor Society

- In the **Student Council**, you can run for various positions from President to Activities Coordinator. Elected students help shape students' experiences at Enlightium Academy.

Spiritual Development

Enlightium has a Spiritual Support Team dedicated to offering spiritual resources for staff, faculty, students, and their parents. Enlightenment also provides several opportunities for you and your family to connect with our team’s spiritual offerings:

- **Bible Studies** - Bible Studies are held once or twice a month for most of the school year. You can find the dates in Enlightenment’s Knowledge Base (type “Bible Studies”) and on the High School Google Calendar (type “google calendar”). Links to join are sent via Ignitia leading up to each Bible Study.
- **Theology in Action Videos** - The aim of these videos is to cultivate hearts and minds for Christianly action – loving God and neighbor. New videos are shared as a direct message in Ignitia and in the Enlightenment Parents app.
- **Prayer Meetings** - Enlightenment’s team meets twice a week to pray for the school and our students. You can submit prayer requests by searching “prayer form” in the Knowledge Base.
- **Virtual Retreats** - Enlightenment will be hosting half day virtual retreats for Enlightenment students. Students are notified in Ignitia of the theme and how to join.
