Consonant Digraphs th, ch, wh



Rule:

A consonant digraph is two consonants that stay together to make their special sound. Consonant digraph th can be used at the beginning, middle, or end of a word. Examples: thin, father, and path. Consonant digraph ch can be used at the beginning or end of a word. Examples: chin and such. Consonant digraph wh makes the sound you hear in when and whip.
